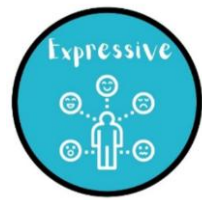

3 Hampshire and 3 Pembrokeshire began the second half of the Autumn term by visiting the Stone Centre Museum in Matlock.



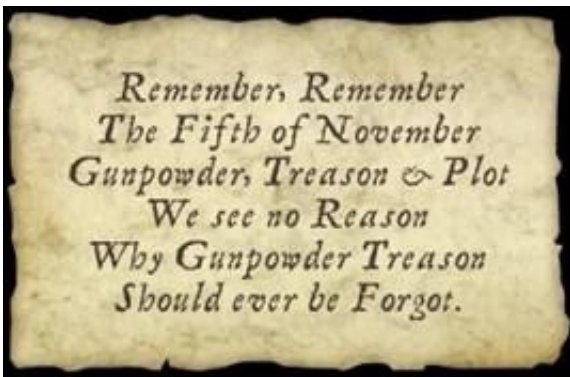
